

In 1954, a group of youngsters, including Earl De La Perralle and Sid Stevens (9 and 13 years old) started a handwritten newspaper called *The Clark Street Sun*. The profits from the sales helped finance sports activities.



- Prevent delinquency, school dropout and criminality




"In order to continue serving the community and help everyone find their place under the sun, we need to reunite all our resources under one roof.






A Place for Everyone Under the Sun
